- the average campus card transaction time response time was 10-15 seconds?
- Most card production systems were not an integrated module of the card system – but a completely manual process ... usually made using a camera mounted to a suitcase?
- Most systems were not owned by schools, or even the food contractor, but instead rented from one company in Rochester, New York?
- The card system database had to be input by hand for all students every single year for days at a time?
